

This is a good time to call your creditors and make sure your rates match those that are advertised.

Creditors make their money off of your interest and late fees and over limit fees. Don't give them a reason to make more money while the economy is so bad. Set up Auto-Pay for your accounts so that you are never late. Most creditors offer this feature for little or no cost. Make sure to check your credit report regularly for inaccuracies.
