

Having a Vision (and maintaining it)

"Sometimes you'll find that happiness finds you when you least expect it"

What exactly is happiness? What is it for you?

- Individualism
- · Peace within ones self
- Self-assurance
- Originality
- Fulfillment
- Freedom
- Making a difference



I like the following definition: The secret of happiness depends on a strong inner self that no exterior circumstances or hardship can ruin. A happiness that everybody can achieve and that's not dependent on wealth or achievements.

Martin Seligman, one of the leading researchers of positive psychology and author of "Authentic Happiness", describes happiness as having three parts: pleasure, engagement, and meaning. Pleasure is the "feel good" part of happiness. Engagement refers to living a "good life" of work, family, friends, and hobbies. Meaning refers to using our strengths to contribute to a greater purpose. Seligman says that all 3 are important, but that of the three, engagement and meaning make the most difference to living a happy life.

The best way to know what happiness means to you is by making it 3 dimensional. The answer is to create a vision board. I first started creating visionboards in 2005 just before graduating high school. I know creating these things tend to see a bit juvenile but after watching the Lifemakeover series on Oprah, it really has helped me figure out what I wanted to do with regards to college and career choices at that time.

To me, vision boards can be used for two purposes; one is to attract what we want in life by pasting images that represent our desire and work as tool for our positive focus and affirmation of these. However after using them for a long time, it is easy to either become impatient or choose words and pictures that "looks good" but might not be completely aligned with our heart's longing, letting only our Egos state what it wants.

Thus the other purpose of making visionboards is allowing ourselves to not determine beforehand what we want to see or seek to find when we do the collages, but to get into a zone of childlike wonder and discovery of our hidden potential as well as suppressed needs. By just browsing through a variety of magazines and letting our intuition and heart speak for us in choosing what appeals to us without any judgment or discernment, when we paste it all together we truly want will emerge on the paper. This can be anything from a need for more fruit and sleep, spending time with
