All-State Training Information

Its August already, this year has flown by. I want to commend everyone on all we have accomplished thus far and also remind everyone we still have lots of events coming up. Along with the different festivals, fundraisers, and other community events we have slated I am excited to tell you that the state has added some absolutely awesome trainings lined up for us at the upcoming All-State.

Noelle Dunckel, the assigned national vice president of the US Jaycees will be leading two training on Saturday, August 15th that I highly encourage everyone to attend. In my recent memory these courses have not been offered in central Ohio and generally there is a fee to attend. The state team has worked it out so, for the first time in recent years these courses will be offered to everyone and free of charge (assuming you're registered for the All-State and the course. See below for directions). I strongly encourage everyone to take advantage of this opportunity, not only are they packed full of very useful information, but they are also a requirement for your degrees if you are taking part in the Passport to Leadership program!

The first course will be JCI Impact and will be offered at 8:00 am in conference room 4 and will be taught by Noelle. This is a course aimed for JCI members who want to become active citizens and create long-lasting positive change in their communities. The course discusses the active citizenship concept, covers the analysis of community needs, solutions addressing these needs and discusses the projects a Local Organization can conduct with all sectors of society in order to create sustainable and effective positive change in their community.

The second course will be JCI Achieve and will start at 1:00 pm, also in conference room 4. The JCI Achieve course uses discussions and analogies to help members understand one's own values and the values and principles of JCI, the role of all members in establishing the Local Organization's identity, the activities needed to fulfill the JCI Mission and develop JCI members into active citizens who will create positive change in their communities.

In order to attend these courses you must be registered for the All-State and also be registered for the courses on the JCI USA website. You must be signed into the site under your own account to sign up, please use the following link and select the two courses that are offered on August 15th,

Use your PMG's, and never be afraid to bring a new idea to the table.

All these "keys" or "Techniques" don't just have to be used within the chapter, use them at work, use them at home, or wherever you are. I promise you will see a difference being made. You can thank Disney for the new outlook on these things, as I do every day, and I feel life has gotten much simpler. Remember that "Be Our Guest" attitude, and treat every person you come across as a potential member, or as someone who might help you on that next event. You got this. 
