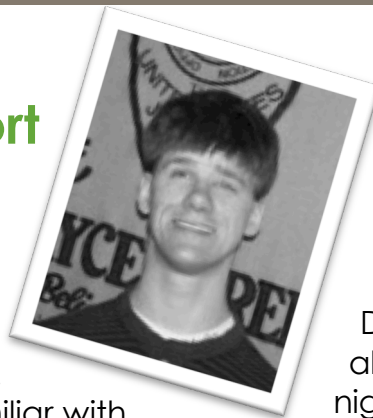

## History of TOYA Secretary Report

The concept for the Ten Outstanding Young Americans (TOYA) was established by Durward Howes for his yearly publication "America's Young Men".



From 1934 to 1936, Howes selected 12 outstanding young men and decreased the number to 10 by 1937. By 1938, Howes gave exclusive publishing rights to Future Magazine, the official publication of the United States Jaycees, at that time. With the advent of women joining into the US Junior Chamber, by 1985, the program changed its name from Ten Outstanding Young Men to Ten Outstanding Young Americans.

Many have been honored as Outstanding Young Americans over the years and each honoree exemplifies the fifty-two words in the Jaycee Creed and dedication to creating a better nation. Some prominent recipients include John F. Kennedy, Gerald Ford, Howard Hughes, Orson Welles, Elvis Presley, Henry Ford II, and Christopher Reeve.

Current, winners are selected on their achievement or contribution in at least three designated areas.
