Historical Impact Secretary Report

Shortly after the 1946 National Convention, Bill Brownfield, a young Jaycee from



Columbus, Ohio, carefully articulated the guiding ideals of the Jaycee philosophy. By September 1947, the national organization officially adopted Brownfield's five-line testament as the Jaycee Creed. By 1951, Brownfield had added a new line to the creed and was soon adopted by Junior Chamber International for what is now the first line of the Creed, affirming the importance of the Jaycees' belief in God.

Today, these 65 words of the Jaycee Creed serve as the foundation of the Jaycees and a guide for life.

Brownfield's Interpretation

When asked to provide interpretation of the Jaycee Creed, below is part of what Brownfield expressed:

- 1. "The creed makes a powerful assertion in the first two words, "We Believe."
- 2. "If we stand fearlessly beside those who seek freedom for themselves, and if we lead out boldly toward the building of a better world, the voice of free men will resound across nations, and men will listen!"
- 3. "But first of all, WE MUST BELIEVE!"

Asian Festival 2016 State Director's Report

This year's Asian festival was one of the smoothest I have ever had the privilege of being involved in, and this was in large part thanks to the North Columbus Jaycees that came out and served their community. This year's festival was estimated at 180,000 people, one of the largest ever.

On top of showcasing Asian countries, population, culture, and food this festival also provides many needed health services to mostly the Asian and Black community free of charge for health issues more prevalent in their communities. Some of the free screenings provided include diabetes screenings, mammograms, heart disease, bone density, children's dental, hepatitis, and many others.

With great weather all weekend, aside from a rouge shower on Saturday, parking and traffic had the potential to be a real nightmare. I am very proud to say that with the help of the chapter's very own

Ashley Gose, Krystal Kost, Leah McPherson, Desiree Evans, Steve Swisher, Matt Burger, Elizabeth Pagano, and Randy everything ran as smooth as I have ever seen even with record setting attendance. This is my fourth year on the Asian Festival board and who knows how many years it is of my festival planning in general, maybe 20th year. One thing that can make or break a festival is the quality of the volunteers, and the Jaycees are a top notch team of leaders. Not only did they handle their assigned and often changing roles with arace, but they were also some of only a handful of dedicated volunteers that stayed and made sure everything was cleaned up and done, working hard for over four hours after the festival had ended... and when I say hard I mean hard manual labor.

I am very proud of the North Columbus Jaycees and all the help they provided as I know the rest of the Asian Festival Organizing Committee is and I am truly proud to be a part of a team that is so committed to excellence and community involvement. This group of individuals makes what could be and in the past has been a really tough job look easy and has a good time doing it.
