Wyandotte, Michigan State Director's Report

On September 22nd – 26th I found myself in Detroit, Michigan with some time on my hands. I drove a group from the North Columbus and North Canton Jaycees up for the JCI National Conference and was chauffeur for the trip. We stayed in a very nice duplex (Air B&B) in Hamtramck as Ashley mentioned in her article (the home of Captain Walter Koskiusko "Painless Pole" Waldowski). The neighborhood and food was amazing and I highly recommend eating/staying here.

With time to explorer while others were in trainings and never having been to Michigan, I got in the car and headed Southwest on 94. Once about 10 miles out of Detroit, I got onto backroads to see what I could find and the first town I pulled into, what I thought was a small river town that looked to have a good diner or two. I parked at the public park and started to walk down the main street (Biddle Ave). Imagine my surprise as I turned the corner, I happened across the Wyandotte Jaycees Haunted House! I assume such a random find must be fate however being a Thursday afternoon it was closed... but not locked... so I may have wandered around a bit inside on my own. If you are a Wyandotte Jaycee and reading this, sorry for breaking and enterina.

After doing some window-shopping I asked a construction worker and then an elderly lady where the best place was to eat in town, because if you're looking for a fair priced local place to eat these are the people you can trust! They both suggested a place called "Nanna's Kitchen" (2962 Biddle Ave, Wyandotte, MI 48192). They were right and I ended up eating lunch there the next 4 days in fact. After lunch, I wandered around a bit more along the riverfront then went back on the clock as a chauffeur.

Day two of my Michigan experience I decided to go back to Wyandotte and

wander around a bit more (and because I saw a cold meatloaf sandwich on the menu at Nanna's I wanted to try). The Wyandotte Jaycees and volunteers were working on the Haunted House and I was able to chat with them. After giving me a tour of the house a couple of members stood outside and talked with me about the local chapter and the area for about an hour. I was relieved and saddened at the same time to hear they were facing many of the same issues the majority of other chapters are facing. With falling membership numbers, a dwindling bank account, and a lack people wanting to volunteer their chapter is still strong but in decline.

I was happy to find out that the local city government works very closely with the chapter and has been providing locations for their haunted houses many years at no cost to the chapter. This relationship with a local government was extremely refreshing to see and is a huge advantage of a smaller town chapter I realized. In Columbus it is difficult to get ahold of someone able to work with you on the cities behalf and generally leaves you feeling frustrated. To get them to donate a property for project use is pretty near imposable.

All in all, I was very happy with my Wyandotte experience and very impressed with their Jaycees chapter and the level of community involvement. They utilize local high school students as volunteers to build and run the haunted house and have a Junior Jaycees program called "Jayteens". With the haunted house and many other community outreach events such as food baskets, toys-4-tots, community dinners and the like they are having a great impact on the local community. It was very refreshing to see a thriving chapter that is facing the same issues faced by many chapters and overcoming... even if it was behind enemy lines.
