First Annual Convention Secretary Report

The first Jaycees annual convention was held in St. Louis, Missouri from



June 17 to 19, 1920. The convention had 41 cities represented from Arkansas, Connecticut, Illinois, Iowa, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, New York, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Texas, West Virginia, and Washington.

Henry Giessenbier, Jr. closed out the first annual convention with the following remarks:

"We have definitely launched a great institution into the world of progress. Let us hope that from this institution will emerge citizens of higher loftier ideals, privileges, opportunities, areater purer patriotism, broader ideas of service and greater capacity for happiness. It may then be that America will enjoy to the fullest extent the continental unity of devotion dedicated toward the up building of a greater American Republic."

This September, the National Convention is held in Detroit, Michigan.


