Our By-laws had not been updated since December 2006. Some of the more notable changes include:

- Updating modes of which a member can apply (previously all applications of membership had to be submitted in writing to the chapter president today, we allow for this as well as via chapter website, email, etc.)
- Allowing existing Board of Directors may serve a second position in an acting capacity until the position has been filled.
- Altering our Third Tuesday of each month's meeting to now focus on Professional Development nights.

How can I use the skills I developed with the Jaycees in the professional world?

We should be sharing our individual stories with every person that we meet that has a desire to make an impact on their community in hopes that they join our cause.

So, what does the Jaycees provide to it members in regards to professional skills? I will name several that I can think of, but I'm sure that there are many more than what I list in this article.

- Teamwork Working as a team to find new members, solve problems within the chapter, initiate new projects, fundraise, plan social events, and develop friendships
- Developing leadership skills Opportunities to lead the chapter in
 the planning of a project, serving on
 the board of directors, mentoring
 others, leading trainings, and public
 speaking.
- 3. Planning a project You have the ability to create & design any type of project that benefits the community. The project could be a fundraiser, community outreach, or social event. We call this document the Project Management Guide. You will outline goals & objectives for the project, a budget, a committee, potential problems & solutions, and a summary of what was accomplished after the project.

- 4. Writing up a business plan Our chapter Civic Leadership Certification is a great training on how to write up a successful business plan
- Fundraising Skills Learning how to create and implement a successful fundraiser
- Public Speaking You will have many opportunities to improve your communication skills in front of a group of people
- Networking Perhaps you wanted to join the a chapter to network with others that have different professions and backgrounds.
- 8. **Money management** You can serve as a treasurer in your local chapter to improve your financial skills
- 9. **Public Relations** Learning how to write up newsletter articles, social media posts, plan events on Facebook, and press releases.

- Mentorship Guidance from fellow Jaycee Members.
- 11. **Finding a career** Do's and Don'ts when interviewing, preparing a resume, writing up a cover letter, and setting up a LinkedIn profile.
- 12. Job Related Skill Set Getting an opportunity to do an internship with a fellow Jaycee that can connect you with the right career opportunity.
