The North Columbus Jaycees new year is in full swing. Looking forward to the following events this year:

- Easter Egg Hunt | April 8th | Chaired by Greg
 Every Year we host the Annual Easter Egg hunt. Before the event
 we get together with the residents of Jaycee Village to stuff over
 2000 plastic eggs with candy. On the day of the event, we rope off
 areas of the park and place all of the Easter eggs on the ground.
 With in minutes after the hunt begins, all the eggs are found and
 the park is full of happy children.
- Ronald McDonald House | Chaired by YOU?
 For more than 30 years, Ronald McDonald House Charities of Central Ohio (RMHC) has served families with seriously ill children by offering a home away from home. Every year, the Columbus RMCH serves more than 4,500 families. RMHC offers a variety of volunteer opportunities, including serving meals.
- Every year we have a big summer party for the residents. We set up a huge tent at either the Jaycee Arms or the Jaycee Village apartments. Members arrive a day in advance to set up and to start cooking the pig and beef. Several members stay up all night, slow cooking the pig and beef. Other members stay up half the night preparing all of the side dishes. The day of the event we have charter buses that pick up the residents from the complex that is not hosting the event and bus them to the other complex. During the event we serve the residents dinner and provide music and dancing.
- Soap Box Derby | Chaired by YOU?
 The North Columbus Jaycees work the return area of the

In the last year I have learned a lot from working with the Jaycees, but I have never really researched the history of the Jaycee organization. I decided to go through our website to see where The United States Junior Chambers started and why. Henry Giessenbier had a vision of an organization that would provide leadership education to young people through community service. He believed that there were four areas of opportunity that needed the most focus. Business, individual, community and international.

The Jaycee Creed states "Economic justice can best be won by free men through free enterprise." By providing opportunities for individual members to contribute to the development and enhancement of the economic infrastructure, prosperity, and well-being for their community as well as nations, this would provide young people the base skills of business management.

Training programs have been developed to be able to allow young leaders to recognize their truest potential in who they are. This is embodied in the creed when it states "Earth's great treasure lies in human personality."

"Service to humanity is the best work of life." My favorite quote of the Creed. Helping our communities. Working within the community develops the sensitivity of individual members to societal problems and dynamics by providing experience in community problem solving. This is what we do on a daily basis.

The last area of opportunity that Giessenbier believed

needed focus is international. This is reflected by the Jaycees Creed when it states "That the brotherhood of man transcends the sovereignty of nations." This area allows individual members to gain the development of goodwill, understanding, and cooperation among all peoples.

When we reflect on these areas as a local chapter, it allows us to become a force for good in the local community. Locating and determining what the community needs. 

The Civic Leadership Certification (CLC)

The CLC is a valuable planning tool for a chapter and is similar to a business plan. It is prepared by the Chapter President with the help of his/her board members. In order for a CLC to be effective, it should outline these key areas to have a successful year in your chapter.

- Goals & Objectives Overall goals & objectives to have a successful year.
- Vision A clear statement of where you would like to see the chapter in the future. It can be stated in terms of size, reputation, prominence, or fundraising.
- Mission A clear statement that is your true motivators for taking action. It is your "why" statement as to why you are a Jaycee
- Membership A chapter should have defined quarterly membership goals, and an action plan to achieve them. A specific plan as to how you are going to find new members, engage, and retain them.
- Calendar of Events Outlines your chapter's calendar for the year.
 Chapter meetings, projects, membership nights, fundraisers, and any other events

- **Budget** Financials for the chapter. Do you have a good understanding of the chapter's expenses and revenues?
- **Fundraising** What types of fundraisers will your chapter be doing? What is your fundraising goal, and what is your plan to achieve it.
- All Other Any other areas that you would like to include in your plan. SWOT analysis of your chapter, community partnerships, and contests that you would like to run throughout the year.

The CLC should be a living document, as it should be updated on a quarterly basis. These updates should include your progress against your chapter goals, the problems areas you have identified, and the solutions to those problems.

Our next training on February 14th will be to review a completed CLC with the chapter.
