My First Event Chairman of the Board's Report

So, I have chaired to events before; Asian Festival and an OSU Parking and traffic event. However, both times my role was somewhat on the small side. With Asian Festival, I mainly did what the Asian Festival Board told me to do and I reported back to the chapter. For the OSU Football game, I was a co-chair for a noon game. So, with these being my first 2 events that I chaired, but in a somewhat limited capacity, I decided to really challenge myself and chair the North Columbus Jaycees Christmas Party. This newsletter article is going to focus on the five main lessons that I learned while chairing this event.

First: Communication

Always use all means of communication possible. This includes, the new portal system that we have set up, emails, Facebook, Linked In, YouTube, and the good old fashion phone call. You should start advertising the project and asking for volunteers as soon as you take the chair position. Create an electronic volunteer signup sheet (ie. www.volunteersignup.org) that lists the times that volunteers are needed as well as a description of their work. Have each volunteer signup on the sheet. Make sure to stay in constant contact with the volunteers. Lastly, typically, whatever the number of volunteers that you think you will need, double it, because something unforeseen could happen and take one or more committed volunteers away from your project.

Second: Written Action Plan

Your action plan should not only consist of the Project Management Guide, but the master volunteer signup sheet, a list of persons or businesses who need to be contacted as well as a list of supplies that you will need for the project. Make sure that everyone on your committee has a copy of your action plan, this way, in case you forget to get something or lose your list, there are other people on your team to back you up.

Third: Early Retrieval of Supplies

A week before you start setting up for the project, check your chapter's inventory for the items on your supplies list. After checking your chapter's inventory, brake your supplies list into 2 list: 1 for the items that you have and 1 for the items that you need. Give both lists to everyone on your committee. Next, start calling various stores to check if they have the items that you need in stock as well as their price. If possible, try to reserve the supplies and retrieve it no less than 24 hours before preparation.

Fourth: Be Early and Bring Food

Make sure to always arrive half an hour before any start time to prevent any early birds from being locked outside and saving you some embarrassment of being late to your own event. Also, there is no better way to lift someone's spirits than to bring them food.

Fifth: Take Charge

This might sound funny, but remember you are the leader. Don't be worried if you are over working your volunteers, or if you are coming across as pushy. Make sure that you stand up and take charge. This is your event.

Lastly, it is okay to feel overwhelmed, for if you don't, you probably are not trying hard enough. Also, while we don't encourage you to fail, it is okay if you do. Sometimes failing provides us with our most valuable lessons. And isn't that one of the reasons for the Jaycees, to provide a safe environment for everyone to try something new and learn from the experience? I think so.
