Jaycee Member site (requires you to create a username and password) provides an overview of your personal Jaycee membership. The site includes various resources including but not limited to useful links (ie. chapter website, Facebook, etc.), chapter information, renewal information, and recruits.

At our June Professional Development Night, we walked through our **Passport to Civic Leadership Program**, accessible via the Jaycee Member site. The Passport to Leadership Program is designed to immerse members into their Jaycee career and help veteran Jaycees grow and develop their skills. The program is designed in 10 phases, or degrees. Each degree introduces the member to a new aspect of the Jaycee experience, develops a different leadership skill, and builds on the skills and steps previously attained. The program is self-directed and members can proceed at their own pace. To access and record your progress, simply click on View Passport within the Passport to Civic Leadership section of Jaycee Member. From there as you complete activities, simply check the item and the item will then be approved by myself or another North Columbus Board of Directors member. PIG ROAST



North Columbus Jaycee is held their annual Pig Roast for the residence of the Jaycee Village and Jaycee Arms on Saturday, June 24, 2017 from noon to 2 pm. This year the location was at the Jaycee Arms.

Thank you to our partnership with **Marshal's Bar in Grandview**, they were generous enough to prepare all the meat for us; all 50 lbs of brisket, 50 lbs of pork tenderloin, and 100 lbs of baby back ribs. In preparation for the Pig Roast, Friday, June 23, approximately 10 volunteers gathering at the Jaycee's Village to start preparing the sides. We worked until about 12:30 am then reconvened at the village at 7 am. Saturday morning, we were able to finish whatever preparations needed to be made such as shredding the beef and between 10 and noon we all started to pair off to go to the Arms to help in the set up of the actual event at noon and the pig roast kicked off without a hitch.

In total, about 150 residents and their families were in attendance. About 15 to 20 of whom were transported from the Village itself. I have heard nothing but good words about the Pig Roast from many of the residents. In addition to all the delicious food – the Jaycees really knows how to cater an event - the DJ, Keeven played his music, the citizens were up and dancing and singing and clapping their hands. At about 2 pm, we were able to get all the residents out and we had everything but the tent tore down by about 3 pm. We brought everything back to the village and we were done by around 5 pm.

I would like to give special thanks to Krystel, Rich, Malachi, Mike, Sonny and his friend Nicole, Nancy, Greg Sr, Steve, Connie, Cliff, Ashley, and especially Greg III who ran the whole operation. I would also like to give thanks to our DJ (Keeven) and Marshals who prepared all of the meat for us. Once again this is a great Pig Roast and I have heard nothing but good words about it and it's probably been one of the smoothest pig roast that we have ran for a very long time.

4 TIPS TO PROMOTE CAREER DEVELOPMENT IN YOUNG PROFESSIONALS

If you are feeling unchallenged, bored, dissatisfied or stuck at your current position at work, you're not the only one.
