Hello Ohio Jaycees!

In business you want to have goals, specific measurable goals, you want to try and identify potential problems and solutions. Basically, you want to be prepared and ready for success. The same is true in our chapters.

Some of the things that we have, by law, is to make sure that our chapters are incorporated organizations within the state of Ohio. Each chapter also has to have some sort of insurance, as this protects our members as well as the organization.

Another requirement is that we have to file with the IRS, even if the chapter is small and we make little to no money. The IRS requires that all chapters file a return. The form is the 990, however your chapter can file the 990N if your budget is less than \$25,000.

Another thing to remember is you have to know where you want

the chapter to be at the end of the year. Do you want to be growth? If so, by how much? Be realistic but specific with your goals; are you really likely to grow by 30 members or does increasing your chapter by five members sound more likely? Do you expect to raise \$100 more for Riley's Toys this year than you did last year?

Why am I bringing this up? Well, these are just some of the items that are part of the Blue Chip and as members of individual organizations (local chapters) your chapter success is important to all of us. Remember, the Blue Chip is simply a business plan to help your chapter get to where you want it to go.

The initial Blue Chip submission should include:

- Chapter Plan of Action
- Membership Plan
- Calendar of Events
- Copy of By-Laws
- Copy of Corporation Papers

- 990 Filing
- Board of Directors Directory

The initial Blue Chip submission should be emailed to kimberly7898@hotmail.com by February 20th. If you need more time, please let me know and I will try to accommodate you.

We have an excellent team of trainers this year who are willing to travel to your chapter if you should need assistance or want training on Blue Chip, Award Submissions/POC, CPG's or any other area your chapter needs.

Please let me know if you would like to have someone come in to train and we will get that setup for you.

So you are the secretary of your local Jaycee chapter this year...Congratulations!!! Did you know that your role is a very important role within your chapter? Well, it is! You ARE important!!!

One of your roles is to take the minutes at your chapter's meetings. Minutes? What are those? Simply put, minutes are notes taken during the meeting to record what was discussed and what was agreed. They don't need to be anything fancy; they just need to clearly include the facts.

Minutes are important to remember what your chapter decided to do, who is going to do it, etc...no matter the size of the meeting. A big meeting or a small meeting, minutes are important! Also, by having a written record of the meeting it will keep the members who were not present up-to-date and informed of what the chapter is doing.

Taking minutes during the meeting is not the only thing you need to do as secretary. After taking a rough set of notes during the meeting you should then type

the minutes, distribute a copy to relevant people, and also keep an ongoing collection of all minutes throughout the year.

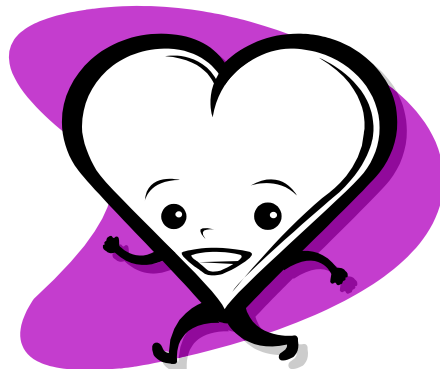
